Why is it important to ask about and document human rights abuses?

- Many people claiming asylum have been subjected to abuses such as torture, domestic violence and modern slavery
 - Very few people are ever asked by a health professional about this abuse
 - Asking about abuse, and recording it, can have significant health benefits for an individual
- People often have psychological and physical symptoms and signs that can help to evidence their allegations of human rights abuses
